

**THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN *BULLYING* BEHAVIOR AND THE  
LEVEL OF SELF CONFIDENCE YOING STUDENTS OF MTs  
MUHAMMDIYAH TEMPUREJO NGAWI**

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**ABSTRACT**

**Background :** *Bullying* is a form of violence that is often perpetrated by individuals or groups that affect other individuals with the intention to harm others. In Ngawi there are 51 private faith-based junior high schools. Of the 51 schools, within one semester of the new academic year 2022/2023 at MTs Muhammadiyah Tempurejo, there were 3 cases of bullying, both physical, verbal and cyberbullying which caused 3 students who were victims of bullying to leave school. **Objective :** analyze the relationship between bullying behavior and self-confidence levels in adolescents MTs Muhammadiyah Tempurejo Ngawi. The impact of bullying at school makes students feel inferior, withdrawn, afraid to socialize, and lazy to go to school. Students who have experienced bullying at school experience low self-esteem. **Method :** research used quantitative using correlational descriptive design with Spearman test. **Result :** The result showed that the most bullying behavior with moderate bullying categories was those with sufficient level of self-confidence of 90,9%. The results of the Spearman test with a sig value of 0.883 which means a sig value of  $>0.05$  then  $H_a$  is rejected and  $H_o$  is accepted. **Conclusions :** there was no relationship between bullying behavior and self-confidence levels in MTs Muhammadiyah Tempurejo Ngawi adolescents.
