EFFORTS TO INCREASE KNOWLEDGE ABOUT

FIRST AID FOR BURNS IN HOUSEWIVES

WITH VIDEO EDUCATION MEDIA

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SUMMARY

Background: The burn mortality rate in Asia is 6.76%. The incidence of burns in Indonesia has increased by 1.3% in 2018, the majority of which occurred in women around 1.4% with the incidence of burns in Central Java 1.0%. Inappropriate first aid such as using soy sauce, toothpaste, butter, and coconut oil is still often found in the community, in the treatment group there were 13 mothers (31.7) in the good category, 12 mothers (29.3%) in the moderate category and 16 mothers (39%) in the poor category, thus the need to increase knowledge and prevent errors in providing first aid. If first aid is fast and precise, it will reduce the risk of complications and wound healing time will be faster, otherwise it will affect the condition of the wound and prolong the wound healing time. Methods: Delivery of information using educational video media to increase knowledge about proper first aid for burns at home. **Objective**: to provide information that can help improve the knowledge of housewives. Results: The output of the video entitled "First Aid for Burns at Home Appropriately" video duration is 04.58 minutes with a file size of 291 MB. **Conclusion**: The video output can disseminate information to the public to prevent mistakes in performing burn first aid.
