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RELATIONSHIP WITH ADHERENCE TO TAKING MEDICINES IN HIV/AIDS PATIENTS IN SURAKARTA LENTERA

ABSTRACT

Background: AIDS is a disease caused by an infection with a virus called Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). Appropriate parenting can effect Antiretroviral (ARV) therapy of children infected HIV/AIDS. The most important factor in the success of ARV therapy is the adherence of HIV/AIDS to taking medication. **Objective:** To know the relationship of foster pattern with adherence to taking medication in HIV/AIDS patients in Surakarta lantern. **Method:** Quantitative research using a cross sectional approach. Sampling using purposive sampling techniques, with the number of research samples of 27 respondents, instruments using questionnaires. Data is used method of Univariat, sufficient and chi-square. **Result:** The results showed as much as 14 people (51.9%) Respondents received a good foster pattern from his caregivers and 16 people (59.3%) The respondent has a obedient level of obedience. **Conclusion:** Parenting for patients with HIV/AIDS is good, the level of compliance with medication in HIV/AIDS patients is compliant, so there is a relationship between parenting and medication compliance in patients with HIV/AIDS in Surakarta Lentera.
